

## 2018 Executive Summary of the GC Admissions Match

### *Number of participants*

#### **Applicants**

- Registered for the match: 1328
- Participated in the match by submitting rankings: 771
- Participants matched: 402 (52.1% of those submitting rankings)
- Additional applicants filling slots from the unmatched applicant pool or due to unforeseen circumstances: 3

#### **Programs**

- Programs participating: 43/43
- Programs filling in the match: 42/43 (99.5%)

### *Likelihood of top placement*

#### **Applicants**

- Applicants who matched on average ranked 5.7 schools, those who did not averaged 3.3 ranked schools
- Most applicants (95%) matched to one of their top three choices
- Applicants should be prepared to attend any school they rank, as 5% of applicants matched to their 4<sup>th</sup> ranked school or lower

#### **Programs**

- Most programs (88%) had at least one top ranked applicant from within their initial standardized rank
- The majority of slots were filled with applicants from within the first or second choice set of standardized ranks (68%)

### *Reported advantages of the match from applicants and programs*

- Reduced pressure and stress
- More efficient
- Fairer and more transparent process

#### **Demographic**

Of the 1328 unique applicants:

- 88.2% reported female gender, 11.5% male gender, and 0.3% other
- 71.4% identified as white, 13.6% Asian, 7.4% Hispanic/Latino, 2.8% Black/African American, and <1% Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander or American Indian/Alaskan Native
- 198 reported a Canadian home address
- States the with most applicants by home address: CA, PA, IL, NY, MI, TX, OH, FL, MN, MA, NC, WI, NJ, MD
